- * 2SLGBTQ+ stands for Two-Spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning, and additional non-heterosexual/non-cisgender sexual orientations and gender identities.
- ‡ A banned book has been removed from a library, school, bookstore or elsewhere, based on the objections of a person or group. A challenged book has been requested to be removed from a library, school, bookstore or elsewhere.
- § A non-apparent disability, sometimes called a hidden or invisible disability, is not immediately obvious. It can refer to chronic illness, pain conditions, mental illnesses, learning and attention issues, physical illnesses, neurodiversity, and many other disabilities that are not apparent.
